Measles Tip Sheet

When to suspect measles:

- With symptoms below AND
- Young children <u>and/or</u> those with recent international travel (including Europe)




Symptoms:

- Fever 3-4 days prior to rash
- Cough, Runny Nose, and Conjunctivitis



- Koplik's Spots 2-3 days before rash, white spots with red halo inside the mouth
- Rash 3-5 days on face and hairline first spread to trunk an extremities, dark red, blanches with pressure, slightly elevated maculopapular

NOTE: Contagious 4 days prior to 4 days after rash onset


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Actions to take when measles suspected:

Give patient and family members procedure mask ASAP

Inpatient: Patient placed in an AIIR (neg pressure) room

- Isolation order: Airborne
- PPE for staff: N95 Required
- Sign to post: White Airborne Precautions *Staff Immunity Required*
- Notify Infection Prevention and Control



Outpatient: Place patient in a single exam room with the door closed

- PPE: N95 Required
- Notify Infection Prevention and Control
 If possible, perform assessment in car <u>or</u> other safe outdoor location; need to wear PPE

Testing:

- · Providers may obtain history from patient
- Contact NM DOH to discuss measles testing
- If testing indicated:
 - Obtain NP <u>or</u> throat swab for PCR using synthetic swab and viral testing media (same as for flu)
 - o Obtain measles IgM serology
